

138 SHIP NAVIGATION AND TRAFFIC AIDS-OTHER THAN BUILDINGS

This code group applies to structures which function as sea traffic navigation/traffic aids.

138 10 BEACON - SHIP (EA)

The U.S. Coast Guard has specific jurisdiction over all aids to navigation (day beacons, buoys, foghorns, etc.,) in the continental United States and in all outlying territories and possessions, except that in the Panama Canal Zone, the Panama Canal Authority has jurisdiction. Day beacons are unlighted structures used to mark isolated dangers or channels, edges, or alignment. They are painted white, black, or red, either separately or in combination. Day beacons are reflectorized for night use. See Harbor and Coastal Facilities, NAVFAC DM-26 for technical information, and International Rules of Road and Inland Waterways, U.S. Coast Guard, for regulations.

138 15 METEOROLOGICAL FACILITY (EA)

138 20 NAVIGATION AID TARGET (EA)

138 25 ANTENNA-NAVIGATION (EA)

This category code is to be used for antennas or antenna systems which are a part of maritime navigational aids. These facilities are planned on an individual basis.
